The new school year of 2025 has officially begun with our time for reflection in the traditional retreat. The theme this year is, "What do you want me to do for you Lord?" It is based on Mark 10: 46-52. This coming week will be our first week of classes.

Of the 32 young S6 (12th grade) students who have just graduated in December from St. Aloysius, half of them received scholarships of varying amounts from you during these last 6 years! I'm very happy to report that now 6 of our 32 graduates have been accepted to enter the Daughters of Mary, as novices! We are thrilled that these young women will hopefully become sisters who will serve our people with care and sacrifice!

Of the 68 girls who finished their S4 (10th grade) year and received their Ordinary Certificates, some of these young ladies will be starting nursing school programs as is the case every year. There are many other popular apprenticeship programs such as sewing and fashion design that some girls also plan to do. For many of these students it is necessary that they get a good job soon to start helping their families financially.

In other news, our new curriculum program being instituted in Uganda is continuing to change which makes teachers as well as students learn new methods of learning. The curriculum now focuses on critical thinking and less on memorization of facts.

We hope this letter finds you, our dear friends, doing well. Your care and support for our girls means so much. We are filled with gratitude for whatever help you can give us.
