A few of our scholarship girls are from northern Uganda and they only go home at the end of the school year which is at the Christmas holiday time as the cost of traveling home is too much for their families.

This year's students who will be testing in the fall are now returning early so they can start reviewing and doing extra studying to prepare for the fall government tests. Last year many of our young women did very well on these tests. We are hopeful that this year's candidates will do as well.

Two of our students, Whitney and Ann Olivia, qualified to attend a special business and entrepreneurial conference in Kampala during their spring break. It is called the Stanibic National Schools Business Champion Boot Camp. We are so proud of all our girls who tried out by working on innovative business ideas. Our student, Whitney, did exceptionally well by finishing in the top 20 out of hundreds of both boy and girl learners. All these students are developing qualities that will serve them well in their life careers. The villages especially need young women to become leaders.
